

PE and Sports Premium

Background:

The PE and sport premium is designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils. After the success of the London 2012 Olympic and Paralympic games, the Government is spending over £450 million on this funding over the 3 academic years 2013 to 2014, 2014 to 2015 and 2015 to 2016. All schools with 17 or more primary-aged pupils receive a lump sum of £8000 plus a premium of £5 per pupil.

For the academic year Sept 2013- August 2014 we received an amount of £8,325 and for the academic year September 2014 - August 2015 received £8365. For September 2015 - August 2016 we are receiving £8355.

Key aims for PE and Sport Premium at Chadlington School

- To provide high quality Physical Education teaching in lessons for ALL pupils through a specialist PE teacher
- To improve the quality of teaching in all lessons through support from the specialist teacher, provision of schemes updated in line with the new National Curriculum and attendance at INSET opportunities.
- To provide equipment that is fit for purpose, suitably challenging for the pupils and increases activity.
- To increase participation in external competitive sports events and festivals
- To maintain and increase the national curriculum requirements for swimming.
- To achieve the Sports Mark award at a Bronze Level and the afPE Quality Mark

Delivery and Impact:

1. Specialist PE teacher

- To provide ALL pupils with specialised teaching in dance, gymnastics, games and athletic
- To improve the quality of teaching in all lessons through support from the specialist teacher, provision of schemes updated in line with the new National Curriculum and attendance at INSET opportunities.

Since April 2013, the school has used PE and sports premium funding to employ a member of staff to teach PE to all pupils for 1 day a week. The role of the specialist is not only to provide high quality sports teaching and improve the PE curriculum, but also to develop class based, non-specialist teachers who provide the second hour of teaching a week by modelling good practice and providing resources.

The PE co-ordinator and specialist teacher reviewed the curriculum map at the start of the sports premium scheme and adapted it to cover all aspects of the new National Curriculum. The map was designed to make use of the teachers' strengths and to provide opportunities for development. The programme also ensures that children participate in a broad range of activities which compliment intra and inter school competitions. This curriculum map is displayed on the school website.

Pupils are making good progress in PE. At the end of 2014/15 all children were achieving the expected levels in all aspects of PE. The on-going focus is for more children to achieve above expectations in a wider range of activities.

2. Equipment

Here, the aim is to provide equipment that is fit for purpose, suitably challenging for the pupils and increases activity.

The equipment that has been purchased has enabled children to work in smaller groups so they are more active and get more opportunities to acquire new skills. The equipment suitable for younger children has proved particularly worthwhile as it has enhanced their learning experience. Some equipment has also been purchased for lunch and break times. This has supported play and activity at breaks.

3. Travel

- To increase participation in external competitive sports events and festivals
- To maintain and increase the national curriculum requirements for swimming.
- To achieve the Sports Mark award at a Bronze Level

As a small rural school travel is a key factor in enabling the children to access partnership competitions and festivals. During the academic year 2014/15 most children attended events giving important opportunities for the more able, for promoting a positive attitude to sport and for children to experience large scale sporting occasions. This involvement in level 2 competitions and events was key to achieving the Sports Mark at Bronze level.

Swimming - Key Stage two children are taken to Chipping Norton Leisure Centre to learn to swim in different groups during alternate terms throughout the year. Those unable to swim towards the end of Year 6 are offered additional lessons.

PE and Sport Premium funding 2015/16

The aims continue as above with a focus on attending INSET opportunities. The prestigious afPE Quality Mark was obtained in summer 2015, and we aim to continue with the good progress recognised in this award. We will also be monitoring closely how many children work above expectations and how we can support more to achieve this.
